JOBS AND ECONOMY	 Will strengthen our economy through tax relief for working families, raising wages, closing corporate tax loopholes, and investment in infrastructure.¹ Will create millions of jobs rebuilding America's aging infrastructure and through responsible development of domestic energy resources.² 	 Tax plan would increase U.S. deficit by \$9.5 trillion.¹³ Tax plan gives richest top 0.1% an average of \$1.3 million tax break.¹⁴ Has displaced American workers through visa programs.¹⁵ Believes workers' wages are too high.¹⁶

OUR SECURITY	 Respected nationally and abroad for her foreign affairs knowledge and competence.⁷ Pledged to defeat ISIS and fight global terrorism.⁸ Built a global coalition to impose sanctions on Iran,⁹ expanded global anti-terrorist efforts,¹⁰ and brokered a ceasefire in Gaza,¹¹ as Secretary of State. 	 Has no foreign affairs experience. Praised Russian President Putin,²¹ advocates ground wars in Middle East,²² sparked a serious discussion in the United Kingdom of banning him from country.²³ Threatens our safety and security by encouraging violence against opponents and treating women, minorities, and people of faith with disrespect.^{24,25}
IMMIGRATION	Will push for comprehensive immigration reform to create a pathway to citizenship, keep families together, and enable millions of workers to come out of the shadows. ¹²	 Proposes wall to stop undocumented immigration, though most undocumented immigrants arrive in U.S. legally and overstay visas.²⁶ Proposed deportation plan would create "police state."²⁷

U.S. SENATE (D)



Since his election to the United States Senate in 1998, Chuck has made improving New York's economy his top priority. Schumer is the senior Senator from New York and a key member of the Senate Democratic Leadership. If the Democrats retake control of the Senate, he will become Majority Leader of the Senate, and from this key position, he will be able to help bring more federal support to New York for infrastructure and other needs.

He is a strong union supporter, longstanding advocate of infrastructure spending, and a champion for the middle class. He was a key ally in negotiating the Extension of the James Zadroga Act providing medical care and compensation to hundreds of LIUNA members who became ill because of their work at the WTC after 9/11.



FEATURED CONGRESSIONAL PROFILES



Congresswoman Carolyn B. Maloney is a Democrat and was first elected to Congress in 1992, representing New York's 12th Congressional District in New York City. Carolyn is a strong champion for New York, spearheading efforts to marshal federal aid for our post-9/11 recovery and security needs, and she has been a huge advocate to meet the health care needs of 9/11 rescue and recovery workers. She also has succeeded in securing millions of dollars in funding for the Second Avenue Subway project six years in a row. Maloney is leader on many union issues.



Sean P. Maloney currently represents New York's 18th Congressional district in the U.S.House of Representatives in the Hudson Valley. He is a member of the Transportation & Infrastructure Committee and has supported more investment in infrastructure, helping to create construction jobs and rebuild American roads, bridges and mass transit systems. His top priority is fighting for middle-class families to create good paying jobs, and protect access to quality education and healthcare in the Hudson Valley. He is also one of the few Democrats in Congress to vote to approve the Keystone XL Pipeline based on his belief that jobs and economic development outweighed the environmental issues.



Jack Martins is a Republican, who has represented a Long Island district in the New York

State Senate since first winning election in 2010. In 2016, he is a candidate to represent New York's 3rd

Congressional District on Long Island. Senator Martins is the Chairman of the New York Senate's Labor Committee and co-chair of the Senate's Task Force on Workforce Development. Before being elected to the Senate, Jack was a union contractor on Long Island and still is involved in the family business. He understands union construction and has been a strong supporter of issues important to our union and its members.



Congresswoman Elise M. Stefanik proudly represents New York's 21st District

(the North Country) in the House of Representatives. She is the youngest woman ever elected to Congress, elected in 2014 at age 30. She has been a strong LIUNA supporter in Congress and has worked hard to bring more infrastructure funding to the North Country. Stefanik voted in favor of the Keystone Pipeline and is a steady supporter of prevailing wage protections for construction workers.



FEATURED STATE SENATE PROFILES



Todd Kaminsky is a Democrat running for State Senate's 9th District on Long Island.

He is currently serving in this position after winning a special election this Spring. Kaminsky was elected to the New York State Assembly in November 2014. As assemblyman, he has delivered results for his district including speeding up the state's reimbursement schedule for Sandy housing reconstruction. While serving in the NYS Legislature, he has been a sound supporter on our union issues including the sponsorship and passage of a mold abatement bill last year.



In 2014, Murphy was elected to the New York State Senate representing the 40th District in the Hudson Valley. His father was a union leader with UWUA 1-2 who worked for Con Edison and taught him the importance of hard work, dedication, and commitment to community. Murphy is running for re-election in the New York State Senate to provide an opportunity for everyone to succeed. Murphy has paved the way for more than \$250 million worth of economic development in his district and has been a strong supporter of our union issues including pipeline construction.
